Columbus Day, 2016

There is a wonderful story recounted by the dean of Catholic historians, Msgr. John Tracy Ellis in his 1984 work, American Bishops: A Memoir. Ellis, who died in 1992, dedicated one of his chapters to the first auxiliary bishop of Baltimore, Bishop John M. McNamara (1878-1960). After the Archdiocese of Washington was created in 1947, Bishop McNamara continued to serve at his beloved parish, Saint Gabriel's Church in Northwest Washington was created in 1947, Bishop McNamara continued to serve at his beloved parish, Saint Gabriel's Church in Northwest Washington. Msgr. Ellis, who at the time was a professor of church history at the Catholic University of America, was a weekend associate at Saint Gabriel's, and was able to take in first-hand, the charm and warmth of this holy bishop. Bishop McNamara had a real gift with children and loved to offer the children's Mass at the parish (a different era indeed...what distinguished it from the other parish Masses was that there were lots of kids, and many good sisters with counting clickers and who made sure the children knew all the proper postures of the liturgy).

Well, as the story goes, the good bishop was talking to the children about the glories of the state of Maryland (from which the District of Columbia was carved in 1799). He said, "Isn't it wonderful that our state of Maryland was named after the Blessed Virgin Mary?" After the children's Mass, Msgr. Ellis sheepishly, but authoritatively corrected Bishop McNamara: "I hate to disappoint you, Your Excellency, but Maryland was named after Queen Henrietta Maria, the wife of King Charles I, who granted the charter of the Maryland proprietary to Cecil Calvert, the second Lord Baltimore in 1632." Bishop McNamara responded to the scholarly Ellis, "I wish you had not told me that."

Still it was and Anglican king of England married to a Catholic queen who granted a charter to a Catholic English lord, not only to guarantee the freedom of worship to English Catholics suffering disenfranchisement in a post-Reformation England, but freedom of religion for creeds...quite radical in that period of history, some one hundred and forty four years before the American Declaration of Independence. And all this was set in place by another great figure in history, Christopher Columbus himself, who opened the gates to the New World in 1492.

Recently, the "Admiral of the Ocean Sea" has been vilified as a bloodthirsty proto-imperialist, bent on destroying the indigenous cultures of the New World. In reality, Columbus was a fervent Catholic, who faithfully prayed the Divine Office and who had a chaplain accompany him on his journeys. Recent attacks on Columbus are doubtlessly rooted in an anti-Catholicism in America that seems to be once again rearing its ugly head. And if we didn't have Christopher Columbus, we wouldn't have our beloved Knights of Columbus. Or they would just have a different name.

On this Columbus Day, we recall the great admiral dispatched by the Spanish crown so many years ago, remembering that he is the one responsible for the beginnings of the Church here in the New World.
