## “A World Turned Upside Down”

This coming Saturday, February 11, the Church commemorates the Memorial of Our Lady of Lourdes. On this day, in 1858, the Blessed Virgin Mary first appeared to a fourteen year old girl, Bernadette Soubirous, a native of this small French village of the banks of the Gave de Pau River, at the foot of the Pyrenees on the Franco-Spanish frontier. Seventeen subsequent visitations continued through July 16 of that same year, and, on March 25, the Solemnity of the Annunciation, Our Lady told Bernadette in the French dialect of that region, “I am the Immaculate Conception.” Our Lady’s statement to young Bernadette was quite astonishing, in that less than four years prior (December 8, 1854), Blessed Pius IX declared the dogma of the Immaculate Conception. The veracity of the apparitions was rapidly confirmed and by 1862, thousands of pilgrims began to flock to Lourdes, seeking spiritual and physical healing from the copious springs near the grotto of Massabielle. In 1864, Bernadette entered the Sisters of Charity and Christian Instruction at Nevers and died in 1879. Bernadette was beatified by Pope Pius XI in 1925 and was canonized by Pius in 1933.

To this day, Lourdes has been the site of countless miraculous healings of both organic and nervous disorders. The late John Cardinal O’Connor, archbishop of New York from 1984 until 2000 once described Lourdes as “a world turned upside down.” Whereas “enlightened” society views the sick as a “troublesome inconvenience,” so to speak, at Lourdes, the sick, or the “malades” are looked upon as nobility who are to be cared for and revered. It is one of the most moving places in the world. It is a place of intense quietude, prayer, and hope. And when one goes to Lourdes, the visitor is quick to recall the upbeat sentiments of the English Catholic writer, Hilaire Belloc (1870-1953):

Wherever the Catholic sun doth shine,  
There’s always laughter and good red wine-  
At least I’ve always found it so.  
Benedicamus Domino!

Lourdes is a fun place too. But that’s what we Catholics do! The authentic Catholic loves life, is filled with joy, and never gloomy!

In his May 13, 1992 Letter Instituting the World Day of Prayer for the Sick, Saint John Paul II, no stranger to injury and serious illness designated February 11 as “World Day of Prayer for the Sick.” In this document, Saint John Paul writes:

‘This is a special time of prayer and sharing, of offering one’s suffering for the good of the Church, and of re-minding us to see in our sick brother and sister, the face of Christ who, by suffering, dying, and rising, achieved the salvation of humankind.’

In November 2000, the Netherlands, a nation ravaged by the ferocity of Nazi madness fifty-five years earlier, was the first nation to legalize so called “assisted suicide” (read, euthanasia) of the sick and vulnerable. Although Americans asserted “It can never happen here,” five years later during Holy Week and Easter of 2005, Americans watched in horror as Terry Schiavo, a forty-one year old Florida woman, who had suffered a brain injury as a result of cardiac arrest in 1990, died on March 31 as a result of a court order denying her proper nourishment and hydration, despite the fact that her condition was not life-threatening at the time. As of this date, “assisted suicide” or “physician assisted death” is now legal in six states: California, Washington State, Oregon, Vermont, Colorado, and

Montana. An “assisted suicide” bill was signed into law in the District of Columbia in November 2016, but the United States Congress is seeking companion legislation to block this deadly law. Sadly, New York State has begun a vigorous campaign to introduce this legislation.

All of us have at one time been sick, may be ill at the moment, or have witnessed the sufferings of friends and family members. There is nothing romantic or pleasant in illness. A very holy New York priest, who has since gone back to God once said, “It is very hard to pray when one is sick.” But illness is a time when one can unite sufferings with the Crucified Christ, and that gives suffering and illness that redemptive character and value. As we prepare for the upcoming World Day of Prayer for the Sick, may we hold dear to our hearts, all our friends, relatives, neighbors, and parishioners who are sick, remembering that by virtue of their suffering in Christ, they are true royalty!----
