Prayers for Our Nation

Every historical period in our nation has experienced division and rancor in some form or another. Loyalists to the British crown and patriotism – all denizens of the American colonies, hammered and slashed at each other during the struggle for independence, 1775-1781. the storms of disunion began as early as 1832 when the Nullification Crisis resulted in a near secession of the state of South Carolina over collection of federal tariffs, and continued with the Kansas-Nebraska Act of 1854, repealing the Missouri Compromise of 1820 which prohibited slavery north of the latitude 36 30. In February and March, 1861, President-elect Abraham Lincoln, on his way from Springfield, Illinois to his presidential inauguration in Washington D.C. was forced to pass through Baltimore, Maryland *in cognito* for fear of being assassinated by secessionist mobs. President Woodrow Wilson incarcerated opponents of American intervention in World War One – the most noted being the American socialist party candidate for president, Eugene Debs, who received over one million votes in the 1920 presidential election...behind bars! In the wake of the Pearl Harbor attack on December 7, 1941, our neighbor, President Franklin Roosevelt instituted a policy resulting in the internment thousands of Japanese American families – citizens, no less, on the West Coast for fear of espionage (I would highly recommend the exhibit on Japanese Internment at the Roosevelt Presidential Library here in our town...a must see). Divisions created by American military involvement in Southeast Asia are certainly felt to this very day, and are carried over to views toward American involvement in the First and Second Iraq Wars and the war in Afghanistan.

With the exception of perhaps the American Civil War, divisions in our nation have not been so rife as in our very day.

A political columnist, rightly distressed by the vitriol aimed at the President of the United States laments that no religious figures have voiced concern, calling for civility and peace in the public square. I would never presume to be a religious leader, so to speak, but it is indeed disturbing that clergy have by and large remained silent on the events that surround us.

In a democratic republic such as these United States, where a two-party system prevails, one side is elected and the other side concedes the election. For the two hundred and twenty seven years since Rhode Island was the last of the thirteen original states to ratify the Constitution, this system, for the most part, has worked pretty well, with the exception of the elections of Abraham Lincoln in 1860 and Donald Trump in 2016. This is sad and disturbing. Will this be the course of every election in the future of our nation?

Proper civic discourse is a Christian virtue. As we see in the Gospel of Mark 12: 17 (render to Caesar what is Caesar's), Jesus had a great respect for civil authority and

as people of faith, we expect our civil authorities to protect us and to respect the human person and natural law. And so, through the intercession of the great sixteenth century English jurist and martyr for the Faith, Saint Thomas More, we pray for unity and for peace in our nation.

WELCOME FATHER THOMAS LUTZ!

His Eminence Cardinal Timothy Dolan has appointed Father Thomas Lutz, longtime parochial vicar and later-pastor of Saint Augustine's Church, Highlands, Ulster County as chaplain at Our Lady of Lourdes High School in Poughkeepsie. Since there is not a priest residence at Lourdes, Father Lutz inquired about residency at Regina Coeli, which I enthusiastically accepted. Ordained in 1993, Father Lutz will be given the canonical status of "residency." Please note that Father will not be not be a parochial vicar here and I am fully aware that his responsibilities of daily Mass and pastoral care at Lourdes will free him up to assist our parish only on Sundays. Father Lutz is no stranger to Hyde Park. A native of Poughkeepsie, Father Lutz's father was the long-time proprietor of a drugstore on 9G in East Park. Father Lutz has relatives, friends, and acquaintances here at Regina Coeli. Looks like a perfect fit! We will be seeing Father Lutz on Sunday's beginning in September.
