His Baby Daughter's Ear Brought Him to God

We haven't heard much about Whittaker Chambers in recent years. Chambers was briefly resurrected by the journalist Sam Tanenhaus in his 1997 work, Whittaker Chambers: A Biography. The veteran radio personality, Don Imus was particularly enamored by this book and helped contribute to a renewed interest in Chambers. In time however, Chambers was once again relegated to the shadows of history. He is rarely, if ever the subject of discussion in college history and political science courses. Those who have developed an interest in this titan of twentieth century American history, have probably encountered him perhaps accidentally, being attracted to his compelling story, and have approached his life in a sort of "home study" fashion.

Whittaker Chambers was born in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania in 1901, and grew up in Lynbrook (that's "Brooklyn," reversed) Long Island. Family life in the Chambers household was artistic, intellectual, and ... disheveled. A brief stint at Columbia University followed by time as a track worker on the Washington, D.C. streetcar system led him down the road to communism, which in the 1920's was popular among American intellectuals disillusioned by the post-World War One materialism and dissipation in Europe and America. Chambers went on to become a full-fledged spy for the Soviet Union, and worked primarily out of New York, Washington, D.C., and Baltimore, Maryland. Chambers was so adept at spycraft that Stalin's Soviet government awarded him the Order of the Red Star in 1937.

And despite his success in the world of cloak and dagger, Chambers still had time to translate a German-language children's book about a little motherless deer. So we can thank Whittaker Chambers for giving us the English language version of Bambi.

Despite his meteoric rise in the Soviet espionage networks in the United States, Chambers was growing increasingly disillusioned with the violence, tyranny, and atheism of communism. Chambers made his dangerous break with communism in 1938, went on to write for Time Magazine, testified in August 1948 against fellow spy, Alger Hiss (1904-1996), and in 1952, completed his magnificent autobiography, Witness. Chambers died of a heart attack in 1961 on his working farm in Westminster, Maryland, and in 1984, President Ronald Reagan awarded Chambers posthumously, the Presidential Medal of Freedom.

What brought Chambers from the grip of communism to freedom found only in Christ? One day, Chambers was feeding his baby daughter and became transfixed with the infant's ear. Looking at the shape and texture, he immediately realized that this was not an accidental phenomenon, but a creation of God. What an epiphany! A little ear was what made this spy go from communist to ex-communist, to anti-communist. And when political analysts and pundits were claiming that main threat was economic and military, it was Chambers who said in Witness: "The problem of communism is not economic communism's; it is atheism."

Chambers went on to embrace the Quaker faith, but as he advanced in years he became more attracted to liturgical Christianity. Although Chambers never converted to Catholicism, he recounts in Witness a Passionist priest who visited Chambers regularly during a long hospital stay in Baltimore after his break with communism. He came to appreciate Catholic priests, "because one could speak in confidence with them."

We live in very dangerous times. It is unfathomable to contemplate, but it seems that many young people are becoming more and more attracted to communism in its many permutations. We have so much to learn from Whittaker Chambers. It is said that he could have easily been another John Dos Passos, William Faulkner, or Ernest Hemmingway, but he sacrificed those ambitions to convey the deadly nature of atheistic communism. Chambers found peace ultimately in Jesus Christ, the Prince of Peace. ~ Fr. Michael Morris
