The Fall Classic, 2017

“The one constant through all the years, Ray, has been baseball.

America has rolled by like an army of steamrollers. It has been erased like a blackboard, rebuilt, and erased again. But baseball has marked the time. This field, this game: it’s a part of our past, Ray. It reminds us of all that once was good and it could be again.”

-Terence Mann, aka James Earl Jones, *Field of Dreams*, 1989.

One baseball luminary described the sport as having two phases: the game in the sun that begins with a definite pastoral flavor, and then by September and October, becomes a tense clash of titans. We are in that moment right now.

I am not inclined to preach or write about myself. I would prefer to focus upon God and the Church - far more interesting than I could ever possibly be. But a recent three-day visit to Cooperstown, New York in Otsego County was so lovely...even spiritual, that I feel the need to talk about that foray into the land of baseball, the home of James Fenimore Cooper, and the magnificent spring-fed Otsego Lake, the headwaters of the mighty Susquehanna River, meandering some four-hundred and forty miles south to the Chesapeake Bay at Havre de Grace, Maryland – the longest American River east of the Mississippi.

The National Baseball Hall of Fame is not the only place to visit at Cooperstown, but it certainly is the biggest draw. Entering the main hall where the Hall of Fame member plaques line the walls can be likened to walking into a holy - an almost sacred space. My sister, a devoted Mets fan who goes to Cooperstown with her husband and boys, sometimes more than once a year, told me whenever she enters that main hall, her eyes well up with tears. Certainly she is not alone. What is also striking about the Hall is the major Catholic presence amongst its honorees. Babe Ruth referred to his teacher, Brother Matthias, F.S.C., who taught the Sultan of Swing during the Babe’s childhood days at Saint Mary’s Industrial School for Boys in Baltimore, Maryland as “the greatest man I have ever known.” The great New York Giants outfielder and third baseman, Mel Ott, had a second cousin, Bishop Stanley Ott, who served as the third bishop of Baton Rouge, Louisiana from 1983 until his death in 1992. In a nod to his cousin, an image of a baseball was included in Bishop Ott’s episcopal coat of arms. The Bronx-born New York Giants second baseman, Frankie Frisch, was known as the “Fordham Flash.” Henry Aaron (who needs no introduction) converted to Catholicism in 1958, and the Mets catcher, Mike Piazza, upon his induction into the Hall in 2016, humbly admitted that any success on the playing field was due to his trust in God and his love for the Church.

In the 1989 classic *Field of Dreams*, the J.D. Salinger-esque fictional Terence Mann, in convincing Ray Kinsella to keep his Iowa cornfield-ballfield, despite threats of bankruptcy and foreclosure says “The only constant through all the years, Ray, is baseball.” It is a beautiful paean to baseball made all the more poetic by Jones, by far one of the greatest actors – and voices in stage and film. Could we not replace the word

“baseball” with “the Church”? As Saint Augustine states, “The Church is ever-ancient and ever-new.”
