Important Rules to Follow Regarding Cremation

On July 5, 1963, the Holy Office (currently the Congregation for the Doctrine of the Faith) issued an instruction permitting cremation of deceased loved ones, while at the same time, emphatically stating that “all necessary measures...be taken to preserve the practice of reverently burying the faithful departed.” In past fifty years, the preference of cremation over the burial of a full body among Catholics has greatly increased. True, cremation of deceased Catholics is permitted, but some Catholics have developed practices regarding the ashes of loved that is inimical to the Catholic faith and respect for the deceased. Common modern-day practices include the scattering of ashes, parting ashes and giving them to friends or loved ones, and keeping ashes in common areas such as a living room. Interestingly, ashes are now “incorporated” into jewelry. For this reason, on October 25, 2016, the Congregation for the Doctrine of the Faith issued its instruction *Ad resurgendum cum Christo* (To Rise with Christ), reiterating guidelines in place since 1963.

According to the new Vatican document, burial of a full body is still preferred. However, when a loved one has been cremated, the ashes must be kept intact in the same way that one would treat a body. It is strictly prohibited to scatter or separate ashes. Rather, ashes must remain in a proper vessel or urn and be immediately interred in a proper cemetery or church columbarium. So the rules are quite clear – the ashes of deceased Catholics *must* be interred.

Unfortunately, it is not uncommon to find the cremated remains of deceased Catholic loved ones in homes. If this may be the case for any of our parishioners, please do not hesitate to contact me and I will be more than happy to help with the arrangements for the interment of such loved ones. These rules make perfect sense – connected with the resurrection of the body on the Last Day. Interment also guarantees that future generations will be able to visit the interment site of their deceased relatives – a true act of love. ~~~~Fr. Michael Morris

EXERCISING CAUTION DURING THE WINTER MONTHS.....

The old Erie Railroad's motto was "Safety First." It is only mid-January and already we have had our fill of snow and ice, and as we have seen, despite vigilance in snow removal, there is always that elusive patch of ice that can present serious problems. Please be very careful during these remaining winter months and if we find that the weather presents treacherous conditions, the Lord certainly understands that remaining at home is the prudent thing to do. Please exercise extreme caution in the event of a weather emergency. We want our parishioners well and safe.

THE COLD AND INFLUENZA SEASON

Health care professionals have deemed the winter of 2018 as a very dangerous time for the spreading of the Influenza virus. It is said that the strain is so strong that even the current flu vaccinations are only 15% effective. With that said, worries over the spread of the virus through hand contact has many of our parishioners concerned, especially at the Sign of Peace during Holy Mass. The Sign of Peace at Mass is *optional*. A simple bow to the person next to you is quite adequate during the sign of peace. And if we encounter parishioners who do not hold their hand out, don't be offended. It is simply a safety precaution during this heightened time of worry regarding the flu epidemic. That's our motto here at Regina Coeli: *Safety First!*
