## Lent 2018

*America is best described by one word, freedom.*  
-Dwight D. Eisenhower (1890-1969)

Pope's Creek, Virginia; Braintree, Massachusetts; Kinderhook, New York; Hardin County, Kentucky; Caldwell, New Jersey; Plymouth Notch, Vermont; Lamar, Missouri; Brookline, Massachusetts; Tampico, Illinois. Some of these towns may be familiar, while others may not. But they all have one thing in common – these towns, some of which no longer exist, and boast an American president as its native son. But of the forty-five towns and cities that claim a president as its own, only our beloved village and town of Hyde Park stands out as singular and unique. And as George Washington left Pope's Creek and settled in Mount Vernon or Harry S. Truman made his way from Lamar to Independence, Missouri, our beloved neighbor and thirty-second president, Franklin D. Roosevelt never left Hyde Park. True, schooling and public service brought FDR to Massachusetts, New York City, and Washington, D.C., but Hyde Park was his true home. And what other town or city beside Washington can assert that the deadliest conflict in world history was planned and executed right here on Albany Post Road? Roosevelt was no stranger to Hyde Park during his twelve-year presidency. FDR made countless trips to his beloved Springwood – the last one, for burial in the rose garden, "near the sundial." So important was Hyde Park to the nation and the world, that when the United Nations was considering a location to build its headquarters, after its official establishment on October 24, 1945, Hyde Park was considered as a possible site for the world body. Had the Rockefeller family not donated the land at Turtle Bay in the East River, perhaps the United Nations would have been right here in our town.

On this Presidents' Day weekend, we should pause and reflect upon this powerful, and at the same time, humble institution of the American presidency. We pray for our president, that he may always be guided by solid principles governed by God's wisdom. And we thank you Lord for all the men who occupied the White House during times of prosperity and want, war and peace. And may we be ever grateful to have the opportunity to live, grow, pray and work in a town that has given one of its sons to the highest office in the Land.

## REVIEW OF ADORATION CHAPEL GUIDELINES IN THE EVENT OF INCLEMENT WEATHER

In the event of inclement weather, please tune into 92.1 FM for school closing listings, or on the web, search "Hyde Park Central School District," [hpcsd.org](http://hpcsd.org). If the district deems it necessary for a school closing or a delayed opening, the Adoration Chapel will be closed and reopen the following day after the 9:00 a.m. Mass.

Just a friendly reminder too, that the exposed Blessed Sacrament is never to be left unattended. On March 25, 2004, the Congregation for Divine Worship and the Discipline of the Sacraments in Rome issued the Instruction, *Redemptionis Sacramentum: On Certain Matters to be Observed and Avoided Regarding the Holy Eucharist*. In this instruction, Exposition of the Holy Eucharist, and the care and protection of the Eucharist is specifically addressed:

[#138] Still, the Most Blessed Sacrament, when exposed, *must never be left unattended even for the briefest space of time*. It should therefore be arranged that at least some of the faithful always be present at fixed times, even if they take alternating turns.
