SIXTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME – JULY 17, 2016

Bethany

Today's reading from the Gospel of Saint Luke 10: 38-42 recounts the first visit of Our Divine Lord to the home of the holy siblings, Mary, Martha, and Lazarus. There is speculation that since Mary, Martha, and Lazarus lived in Bethany, which was located on the pilgrimage route into Jerusalem, Jesus probably noticed them standing on the side of the road, cheering, and encouraging the pilgrims as they approached Jerusalem, as they fulfilled the Jewish precept for the yearly journey to the Temple Mount. Jesus obviously saw something very attractive in these siblings, and as a result, Jesus befriended them and would stay with Mary, Martha, and Lazarus before and after his visits to the Holy City. Their home became a place where Jesus could rest, enjoy wonderful company, and be at total peace as He basked in the beauty of friendship. I am sure that we all have places where we too can be ourselves – the homes of family members, friends, and such. These retreats become our own "little Bethany" where Christian love and friendship thrives and prevails.

We tend to favor Mary over Martha, for it is Mary who takes the time to listen to the words of Jesus, while Martha frenetically busies herself with the necessities surrounding the visit of the Lord. In actuality, the contemplative spirit of Mary compliments the active life of Martha, creating a *unity of life* where work and prayer compliment one another. Taking the necessary time for prayer actually enhances one's work and sanctifies even the most mundane projects and activities. And even though Martha busied herself to the point where she became exasperated by her sister's "resting" in the Lord, Martha was not devoid of a spiritual life. How could she have been? She had the privilege of spending much time in the presence of Jesus. And that time spent with Our Lord assisted Martha greatly in perhaps the time of her greatest sadness and loss – the death of her brother Lazarus as recounted in the Gospel of John 11: 1-44. Although Jesus did subsequently raise Lazarus from the dead, Martha did not specifically ask Jesus to perform this great miracle. Recall, Martha said to Jesus at the tomb of Lazarus, "I know he will rise again in the resurrection on the last day" (John 11: 24). A stunning observation! Long before the death and resurrection of Our Lord – the Paschal Mystery - Martha came to understand one of the greatest truths of our faith: *the resurrection of the body on the last day.*

Jesus drew out from Martha her profound knowledge and faith in the resurrection of the body and the hope of eternal life. Our time in prayer, especially before Our Lord in the tabernacle opens up to us a world of beauty and peace, as well as that prayerful fortitude that will strengthen us in times of suffering, challenges, and contradictions.
