Insurance for Eternal Life

There is a radio advertisement for a foreign language immersion program that states the following:

-Will a new television make you a better person?

-Will a new pair of shoes get you ahead in life?

And a very wise and faith-centered person from Florida is known to say: "No one is going to stand up at your funeral and say, 'She had a really expensive car' or 'He had attended the Super Bowl three times.' Don't make life about stuff!

Our three readings for the Sunday liturgy this weekend, the Eighteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time focus upon things eternal. God desires that we be happy in this world. Saint John Bosco often said, "The Lord wants happy saints, not sad-faced people." The last thing the Lord wants for us is to be reduced to grinding poverty and degradation. Creation is good and should be enjoyed and appreciated. This is why Jesus took on flesh to live among us for thirty-three years – to raise the human person and creation to a new dignity. And yet at the same time, our surroundings, our possessions must point to eternal life. Material things, despite their inherent goodness, are not ends in themselves. History is replete with examples of very wealthy and powerful people who lived sad and empty lives. We look particularly to the story of Lazarus and the rich man, Dives in the Gospel of Saint Luke 16: 19-31. Dives lived a lavish and comfortable life while Lazarus suffered hunger, pain, and oppressive poverty outside the gates of the former's estate. And yet Jesus tells us that it is Lazarus who now enjoys the bliss of Heaven while Dives wallows in eternal pain, sadness, loneliness and spiritual deprivation for his lack of love for the poor.

Earlier this month, the Church in New York bid a sad farewell to one of its great priests. Msgr. James O'Connor, who taught Dogmatic Theology to generations of priests at Saint Joseph's Seminary, Dunwoodie, and then from 1994 to 2014, served as pastor of our neighboring parish, Saint Joseph's Church, Millbrook was known to often say:

God does not expect spiritual and even moral perfection. He simply asks us to humbly return to him and ask forgiveness every time we sin. Willingness to return again and again to the Lord in sorrow for sin is the true mark of holiness.

Humility and contrition. That is part of our insurance policy! In the words of Saint Paul in his Letter to the Philippians, 3: 20: "Our citizenship resides in Heaven." Eternal life with the Holy Trinity, Our Lady, and the Communion of Saints is more important than any material item or gain. Regular reception of the Sacrament of Penance, the perfect path to the Holy Eucharist, will assist us on our pilgrimage here on earth, and will help us to attain our most important goal, which is Heaven.
