ELECTION 2016

Robert Schuman (1886-1963) was a Luxembourg-born French attorney and statesman, who served as the Prime Minister of France from 1947-1948. An ardent foe of both Nazism and Soviet Communism, Schuman was instrumental in the establishment of the Council of Europe (later the European Union), the North Atlantic Treaty Organization (NATO) and the European Coal and Steel Community in 1948.

Schuman, along with the post-World War II chancellor of West Germany, Konrad Adenauer and Irish Taoiseach Eamon de Valera came from a great tradition of civil leaders who loved the Church and saw Her teachings as a leaven to society. As a young man, Schuman felt an attraction to the priesthood, but then came to realize that his vocation was to serve God through the law and civil service. So dedicated was he to the formation of a society rooted in the love of Christ that he remained a consecrated celibate “for the peace of nations.” Schuman died in September 1963, and in 2006, Schuman was declared “Servant of God.” His beatification process continues and please God, some day, if so willed by God, he may be “Saint” Robert Schuman.

Whereas many Catholic political leaders have fallen into a trap which results in their wholesale cleaving of their faith from the responsibilities of civic welfare, Schuman, envisioned a civil society based on the love of Christ. Two years after Schuman’s death, Blessed Paul VI, in an address to the General Assembly of the United Nations in New York on October 4, 1965 asserted that “the Church is the expert in humanity.” With that said, the teachings of Christ, as manifest by Schuman’s political philosophy would serve to guide civil society in the ways of justice, mercy, and truth.

This coming Tuesday, November 8, our nation will elect a new president to guide our nation for the coming four to eight years. As Catholics & American citizens, it is imperative that we choose the candidate (as well as those candidates seeking legislative office on the national, state, and local levels) who is closet to our values, especially in the cause for the defense of human life and the dignity and rights of the family and traditional marriage. In its November 2015 document “Forming Consciences for Faithful Citizenship: A Call to Political Responsibility from the Catholic Bishops of the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops writes:

Decisions about political life are complex & require the exercise of a well-formed conscience aided by prudence. This exercise of a well-formed conscience begins with outright opposition to laws & other policies that violate human life or weaken its protection. Those who knowingly, willingly, and directly support public policies or legislation that undermine fundamental moral principles cooperate with evil.

We are also reminded that the exercising of our right to vote is a moral obligation, and that the participation in the American political process is an act of virtue. In their November 1998 statement “Living the Gospel of Life: A Challenge to American Catholics,” the hierarchy of the Church in America writes:

We encourage all citizens, particularly Catholics, to embrace their citizenship not merely as a duty and privilege, but as an opportunity meaningfully to participate in building the Culture of Life. Every voice matters in the public forum. Every vote counts. Every act of responsible citizenship is an exercise of significant individual power.

Through the intercession of Our Blessed Lady, the Immaculate Conception, patroness of the United States of America, may the true values that made our nation the greatest in the history of civilization prevail, as that we can continue to serve as a beacon of hope to the peoples of all nations.
