## Joyful Preparation for the Birth of the Lord

In the scope of the Advent liturgy, yesterday, December 17 begins that time of Advent when we begin the more intense preparation for Christmas by readying ourselves for the actual birth of Christ. It is also during this period (until December 23) that the “O” antiphons precede the Magnificat (Canticle of Mary) at Vespers (Evening Prayer) in the Divine Office. The “O” antiphons are popularly known through the beautiful Advent hymn “O Come O Come Emmanuel.” Because of its association with the “O” antiphons, this hymn technically is not to make its debut until after December 17.

Although it is not my custom to speak about myself (God is much more interesting than I will ever be), I would like to relate a remarkable story about an event that happened on the Third Sunday of Advent, 1998. For starters, in February 1997, the late John Cardinal O’Connor, then-archbishop of New York had appointed me the temporary administrator of the Most Holy Trinity Catholic Chapel at the United States Military Academy at West Point. Since 1899, Most Holy Trinity Chapel, situated on the grounds of USMA, was a parish of the Archdiocese of New York, staffed by civilian priests of the New York Archdiocese. By 1996, Cardinal O’Connor, a retired Chief of Chaplain of the United States Navy with the rank of Rear Admiral Upper Half (two stars), who had served also as the command chaplain at the United States Naval Academy at Annapolis, Maryland, saw fit to turn the spiritual care of the Catholic community at West Point, to the Archdiocese for the Military Services, USA. My role as administrator was technically to provide spiritual care and to assist in the transition of the parish from the Archdiocese of New York to the Archdiocese for the Military Services. I was told that I could be there “anywhere from two weeks to thirteen years,” depending upon the outcome of the labyrinthine process. As it turned out, I was at USMA for twenty-three months.

Against my own wishes, the good parishioners at Most Holy Trinity insisted that there be a farewell Mass, to be held on the Third Sunday of Advent (Gaudete Sunday), in December, 1998. Monsignor Francis X. Toner, my beloved pastor when I was a parochial vicar at Saint Barnabas Parish in the Bronx came up for the Mass that day and was joined by the USMA priests, Father Edson Wood, O.S.A. and Chaplain Colonel Gregory Sykes, U.S. Army in what was such a beautiful concelebrated Mass. Again, since it was Gaudete Sunday, I, in my role as main celebrant wore rose vestments, while Msgr. Toner, Father Wood, and Father Sykes wore Advent purple chasubles. After the Mass, a little girl of no more than five said to me, “the four of you looked like a giant advent wreath!” What a remarkable observation! In a million years, I would have never been able to come up with that striking analogy! It was a pointed reminder how the liturgy truly “assaults” all the senses and no one overlooks its beauty, when it is reverently directed to God.

Eighteen years has passed since that day in late December. Sadly, Msgr. Toner, Father Sykes, and Father Wood have all gone back to God. . They loved the Church! I have Msgr. Toner’s personal chalice and it has been used in the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass many times here at Regina Coeli. Our parishioner Bob Clonan, as a boy, knew the recently ordained Father Toner during the latter’s service as a parochial vicar at the parish of Bob’s youth, Saint Denis in Yonkers, New York.

Unfortunately, I don’t know what happened to that precocious little girl. She is either a professor at MIT or the next Saint Therese of Lisieux!

We still have another full week of Advent so continued Advent blessings to our wonderful parishioners!.....Fr. Michael Morris
