THE NATIVITY OF THE LORD - DECEMBER 25, 2016

The Nativity of the Lord Christmas, 2016

Saint Bernard of Clairvaux, Doctor of the Church and the great twelfth century Cistercian abbot, in his Sermons for Christmas Eve so beautifully reflects upon the Incarnation which we joyfully celebrate today:

Let us rejoice in the Lord, for our Savior has been born in the world. Today, true peace has come down to us from Heaven. We have heard, my brethren, the announcement, full of sweetness and 'worthy of all acceptance' that Jesus Christ, the Son of God is born in Bethlehem of Judah.' My very soul has melted at the sound of these words and my spirit is burning in my bosom, eager with the constant ardor or desire to communicate to you its own joy and exaltation.

It doesn't get any more eloquent than that!

Christmas blessing to all the members of our parish family. With all the joy that emanates from the reality of the Word made Flesh, there are still many who experience sadness during the Christmas season. So we commend to prayer all our brothers and sisters who are alone, sick, suffering from financial hardship, the effects of war and persecution, or interior depression. This day is especially for those who suffer because the birth of Christ heralds a new era for humanity. Imagine this great humanity, wallowing in the sin of our first parents, Adam and Eve. God the Father could have easily said, "OK ladies and gentlemen, you blew it...you are on your own." But no! God sent His Only Begotten Son, born of the Blessed Virgin Mary – a helpless infant, True God and True Man, so that we can be freed of our sins so that we can have the opportunity to merit Eternal Life. As a result of the Nativity, God's great generosity in sending His Son to live among us for thirty-three years, humanity is elevated to a new dignity and restored to what God really wanted for us in the first place.

Every year, the Metropolitan Museum of Art in New York City, displays its magnificent eighteenth century Neapolitan Crèche along with the beautiful Christmas tree, festooned with billowy Neapolitan angels. In this crèche-tableau, there is all kinds of activity going on with figures engaged in commerce, kings on horseback, napping farmers, and even a man swilling what appears to be a beer. And central to this setting is the prayerful Blessed Virgin Mary, Saint Joseph, and an almost microscopic image of the newborn Christ, being adored by a little sheep, a donkey, and a cow. Some figures in the tableau are very much aware of the miracle of the birth of the Savior, but like the world today, many just go about their business, oblivious to the greatest event in salvation history unfolding right before them. Visitors to the museum – old and young, art-lovers and hipsters, tourists, and the curious are mesmerized by this crèche. As a friend once said, "The Met should put a prie-dieu in front of that crèche."

If somehow that crèche depicted a Christmas morning in Hyde Park, we would all be very much aware of what would be happening. We know that Christ is born today and our lives will never be the same!

May the Newborn savior bless all the members of our parish family and please know that the intentions of this wonderful parish are held very closely in prayer and at the Altar in Holy Mass.

St. Elizabeth Ann Seton, 1774-1821

We must pray literally – without ceasing – in every
occurrence and employment of our lives [making]
a habit of lifting up the heart to God as in a
constant communication with Him....St. Elizabeth
Ann Seton, S.C.

St. Elizabeth Ann Seton was born August 28, 1774 in New York City
and died January 4, 1821. She was introduced to Catholicism in Italy
after her husband died. Following her conversion, she founded a
Catholic school for girls that established the catholic parochial school
system in the United States. She is the patron saint of Catholic
schools and of Maryland.
