## Eucharistic Adoration and Exposition

This past year, 2016 marked the thirtieth anniversary of Eucharistic Adoration and Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament here at Regina Coeli Church. With the exception of perhaps a few short years in the late 1990's. The Eucharist has been exposed in our parish Adoration Chapel, Monday mornings through Saturday mornings without fail. That is pretty extraordinary, and the prayers of our parishioners before the Eucharistic Lord have been an incredible blessing for our parish.

Time marches on and with that, many of our parishioners who have faithfully kept watch with Our Lord have moved, have gone back to God, or can no longer go to the chapel on a regular basis. Still, we are blessed with an incredible number of faithful watchers and adorers. Any time during the course of the day into the evening, there are often not just one, but a number of our parishioners praying in the chapel and keeping company with the Lord. However, there are many hours after midnight through dawn when there is no one who can keep company with Our Lord. This is certainly understandable in that it is difficult for people to travel in the lonely and small hours of the morning. It might even be risky for many to venture out of doors in those hours before dawn. But the fact that the Blessed Sacrament is left unattended is problematic. The safety and protection of the Eucharist is paramount and my chief role as pastor is that of custodian of the Holy Eucharist.

It is also crucial that practices in the parish conform to the will and requirements of the Church, especially in the conduct of the liturgy and the care and protection of the Blessed Sacrament. On March 25, 2004, the Congregation for Divine Worship and the Discipline of the sacrament in Rome issued the Instruction, Redemptionis Sacramentum: On certain matters to be observed and avoided regarding the Most Holy Eucharist. In this Instruction, Exposition of the Holy Eucharist, and the care and protection of the Eucharist is specifically addressed:

[#138] Still, the Most Holy Sacrament, when exposed, must never be left unattended even for the briefest space of time. It should therefore be arranged that at least some of the faithful always be present at fixed times, even if they take alternating turns.

Liturgical and sacramental laws and rules given to us by the Church must always be taken seriously. There is nothing arbitrary about liturgical/ecclesial discipline. These rules are meant to be observed carefully – with love and reverence. The local pastor (as well as parochial vicars, deacons, and lay faithful deputed to function in liturgical roles) is never permitted to re-interpret or craft ecclesial rules according to personal tastes or whims.

With that said, Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament will continue, but with a revised schedule as follows:

Eucharistic Exposition will begin after the 9:00am Mass on Mondays and the Eucharist will be reposed in the Tabernacle on Monday evening at 10:00pm.

Tuesdays through Fridays – The Eucharist will be exposed at 7:00am and will be reposed at 10:00pm.

Saturdays – The Blessed sacrament will be exposed from 4:00pm until 4:45pm, prior to the 5:00pm Vigil Mass.

Great news! Our parishioners still can pray in the church at any hour of the evening through access to the door code. True, the Blessed Sacrament will not be exposed from 10:00pm until 7:00am, but the church will still be available for prayer – and adoration before the Blessed Sacrament. And this brings up the subject of the difference between “adoration” and “exposition.” We “adore” the Blessed sacrament whether the Eucharist is in the tabernacle or exposed in the monstrance. “Exposition” means that the Eucharist is “shown” or “exposed” in the monstrance. Either way, whether we pray before our Lord in the tabernacle or before Our Lord in the monstrance, we are indeed partaking in the act of adoration.

In my almost twenty-eight years as a priest, I would have to look far and wide to see a devotion to the Most Holy Eucharist that could match that of the love for the Blessed Sacrament exhibited by our parishioners here at Regina Coeli. And that will continue. Adoration lives here at Regina Coeli!

Praised be Jesus in the Most Holy sacrament of the Altar!
