SECOND SUNDAY OF LENT – MARCH 12, 2017

Lenten Visuals

“During Lent, penance should be not only internal and individual but also external and social. The practice of penance should be encouraged in ways suited to the present day, to different regions, and to individual circumstances.”

-Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy,
Sacrosanctum Concilium #110,
Second Vatican Ecumenical Council,
December 4, 1963.

Although the above citation refers primarily to almsgiving and acts of charity, the words of Sacrosanctum Concilium could also be extended to the environment and furnishings of the church or chapel. Fresh flowers and plants are reminders of the life-giving nature of our faith. However during Lent (with the exception of the Fourth Sunday of Lent, Laetare Sunday) the use of fresh flowers is prohibited in the church, in an effort to highlight penance and mortification which is the hallmark of the penitential season of Lent. But that doesn't mean that the Church has to sacrifice natural beauty. Let's take for instance the use of pussy willows (Salix caprea). The Eastern Orthodox churches, as well as the Eastern Catholic Church (i.e. Byzantine Ruthenian, Ukrainian, Russian, etc.) use the pussy willow in place of palms on Palm Sunday, and maintain pussy willow branches in their icon corners (red or eastern corner) well beyond the Easter season. In the Latin Rite, it is becoming more and more common to see pussy willows in churches, not only for decorative reasons, but to encourage all of us who partake in the Lenten rigors, a sense of hope in the coming of Spring and the Paschal beauty of Easter. The soft, furry buds have a penitential flavor and still render a sense of sober beauty in the sanctuary.

The penitential seasons of Advent and Lent both have their own distinct shade of violet/purple. This past Advent, the altars and vestments were colored in a bluish-deep purple hue. A lighter violet shade is characteristic of liturgical colors used in Lent. Liturgical purists tend to take the distinctions in Advent-Lenten shades very seriously (I guess that makes me a liturgical purist)!

One of the most powerful visuals (and a sign that the Triduum and Paschal feasts are fast approaching) is the covering of the crucifix, statues, and other sacred images on the Fifth Sunday of Lent (Passion Sunday). The Order of Prayer in the Liturgy of the Hours and the Sacred Liturgy for the Fifth Sunday of Lent, April 2, 2017 reads:

- In the dioceses of the United States, the practice of covering crosses and images throughout the church from this Sunday (April 2) may be observed. Crosses remain covered until the end of the celebration of the Lord's Passion on Good Friday, but images remain covered until the beginning of the Easter Vigil.

We are a body-soul totality. As ensouled persons made of flesh and blood, we need visuals to assist us in the life of prayer. When I taught church history and pastoral formation at Saint Joseph's Seminary, I frequently reminded the seminarians that “Art is not a luxury, it is a necessity.” Beauty, be that art, architecture, and music, elevates the soul. How blessed are we as Catholics that the Church gives us beauty in the liturgy and the worship space. And with the annual changes in the liturgical seasons throughout the year, the interior of our church becomes organic – ever changing.
