Independence Day 2017

Blessings upon our nation as we celebrate this coming Tuesday, the two-hundredth and forty-first birthday of the United States. How time marches on! It seems like just yesterday that we commemorated the Bicentennial, highlighted by the parade of "tall ships" in New York Harbor. Many things have changed in just forty-one short years. But one thing endures. Our country is truly the greatest nation in the history of civilization. Like any human institution, it has its flaws, but the principles of liberty, made a reality on July 4, 1776 in Philadelphia have stood the test of time.

One hundred years ago, this past April 6, the United States declared war upon the German Empire, Austria-Hungary, and the Ottoman Empire. The American Expeditionary Forces (AEF) did not actually enter combat until October 1917, but still, in those thirteen months between the firing of the first American shot that Autumn until the Armistice on November 11, 1918, 116,516 American military personnel were killed. That's a bloodbath, exceeded only by deaths in the American Civil War and World War Two. These sad statistics bring to mind something that few nations can lay claim. While other nations have waged wars of conquest and occupation, the Republic has had only one request: enough land to bury the American dead. That legacy endures today in the magnificently somber American cemeteries in Europe and the Pacific, honoring the American dead, particularly of the wars of the twentieth century.

And so there is much to be thankful on this two-hundredth and forty-first birthday of the United States. We pray that our nation may always be a shining source of hope for the world, and faith in God and trust in His providence may be the hallmark of our country.

This incident serves as a reminder to exercise vigilance during our times of prayer in the church. Thanks to Vector security, security cameras have been installed at all 3 entrances to the church, as well as at the rectory.
