The Jesuit Presence in Hyde Park, 1897-1970

Tomorrow, July 31, the Church commemorates the life of Saint Ignatius of Loyola (1491-1556), who founded the Society of Jesus, with the approval of Pope Paul III in 1540. The celebration of the memorial of this magnificent priest and defender of the papacy calls to mind the presence of the Society in the Town of Hyde Park. In 1897, the Maryland-New York Province of the Society purchased land north of Poughkeepsie that consisted mainly of mills and streams for a future novitiate for the growing order in the Northeast United States. In 1903, Saint Andrew-on-Hudson opened and was consecrated as a novitiate for young men aspiring to be Jesuits. The novitiate proved to be a great spiritual boon for the Catholic parishes in the Lower Hudson Valley. Our parish greatly benefitted from the presence of Saint Andrew's and for many years, Jesuit novices instructed our school children in the ways of the Faith. Sadly, the novitiate closed in 1970, and the property was purchased by the Culinary Institute of America, whose campus at that time was located in New Haven, Connecticut. The Jesuit cemetery still exists and for those who would like to pray at the graves of such Jesuits as the noted anthropologist Father Pierre Teilhard de Chardin (1881-1955), a key to the cemetery can be obtained from the Culinary's security office. Today, visitors to Roth hall, the main building at the Culinary can still see windows, moldings, and railings that bear the Jesuit cipher “IHS”.

A wonderful Jesuit priest who has since gone back to God, told me once of the many visits his family would make from Jersey City up to Saint Andrew-on-Hudson to visit their son and older brother, a Jesuit novice. This little boy, not much older than eleven would take in the activities of his brother and the other novices, and he thought to himself, “I could see myself doing this – becoming a priest.” Eventually, he followed his brother in the Society and later years, both became university professors and college presidents. But the most important of their roles was, of course, the fact that they both served God and the Church as priests.

For many years, the Lower Hudson Valley was dotted with many religious houses and seminaries. Most of these houses of formation and prayer are long gone. And who would have ever thought that our own Regina Coeli Church would have only one full-time resident priest? With that said, may we continue to pray for vocations to the priesthood. Priesthood should be looked upon as a viable and noteworthy calling for any young man – to be encouraged by parents and other family members. May we be motivated by the stark warning of the late Basil Cardinal Hume, O.S.B. Archbishop of Westminster, who at the English Catechesis at World Youth Day, Czestochowa, Poland in August 1991: “No priests, no Eucharist.”

On Tuesday afternoon, June 20, 2017, a rather frightening note expressing virulent-Catholicism (its contents so offensive that they cannot be expressed in this notice) was taped to the front door of the church building. This incident serves as a reminder to exercise vigilance during our times of prayer in the church. Thanks to Vector security, security cameras have been installed at all 3 entrances to the church, as well as at the rectory.
