Feast of the Transfiguration of the Lord

In 2005, I purchased a beautiful icon of the Transfiguration of the Lord from a dealer in icons located in Washington, D.C. It was painted (or as an iconographer would say, "written") by a cloistered nun in Damascus, Syria in 1983. It possesses a noble simplicity, and more wood-toned in nature, as opposed to the richly gold-leaved icons of the Russian and Greek traditions. But the story behind how it ended up in my possession is rather sad. The icon was given to the icon dealer as a gift from a priest shortly after it was completed in Damascus. Tragically, the friendship between the priest and this icon merchant fizzled and she felt a need to dispossess the icon. I have had this icon for twelve years now and I greatly treasure it. But there is that sad reminder that had that friendship not been broken, the icon dealer would still have it as a tool for prayer and meditation. For me, this icon is a reminder of the necessity of friendship and how true Christian friendship "transfigures" us. The icon provides for me the opportunity to pray for people in my life that I have disappointed or have not provided necessary friendship and assistance in their time of need.

The Feast of the Transfiguration of the Lord is such an important event in the church that it takes precedence in Sunday worship, and in this case, the beginning of the Eighteenth Week in Ordinary Time. In our Gospel reading for this Sunday, Matthew 17: 1-9, Jesus takes Peter, James, and James' brother John to the top of Mount Tabor overlooking Samaria (an incredibly high mountain, difficult indeed to climb), and there, Jesus, flanked by Moses and Elijah is "transfigured" before their eyes. It is an incredible act of friendship on the part of Christ. Jesus knew full-well that the apostles would face serious questioning, uncertainty, persecution, and even death for His Name. So Jesus gave them a little glimpse of Heaven. In their hours of darkness, they could look back to that solicitous act of Jesus and know that to follow Him is all worth it.

Saint John Mary Vianney (+1859), echoing the words and sentiments of the many saints who preceded him described the holy Eucharist as the "closest manifestation of Heaven this side of Eternal Life." The Eucharist, Christ's Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity, transforms us and gives us hope as we continue our pilgrimage here on earth

ST. ISAAC JOGUES 1607-1646

Our single endeavor should be to give ourselves to the work and to be faithful to [God]. *From a letter of Isaac Jogues a month before he died.* He was born January 10, 1607 in Orleans, France & died October 18, 1646 in Ossernenon, Canada. He was a Jesuit priest, missionary, and one of the "North American Martyrs." Working among the native population in North America, he was captured by the Iroquois natives twice and was martyred the second time.
