## Solemnity of All Saints; November 1, 2017

A magnificent bas-relief facing for the choirloft of the Basilica of the National Shrine of the Immaculate Conception on the campus of the Catholic University of America in Washington, D.C. was blessed and dedicated fifteen years. It is known as "The Universal Call to Holiness," and depicted on this two-dimensional sculpture are images of many peoples - young and old, lay and clergy, religious and married people, workers and students...all proceeding happily and wholesomely to the triumphant Christ. This artwork is a tangible representation of the Solemnity of All Saints, which we will celebrate this coming Wednesday. On All Saints Day, we celebrate the witness of all saints both recognized by the Church through canonization, and our relatives and friends whose heroic lives of sanctity have won them eternal life. All Saints Day reminds us that sanctity is accessible to everyone, and not the purview of the chosen few.

On the following day, November 1, the Commemoration of all the Faithful Departed (All Souls), we pray for all who have gone before us marked with the sign of faith, but must complete their purification in Purgatory. After all, we must be spiritually "burnished and shined up" in order to behold the face of God. The great spiritual writers liken the longing for God that is a part of Purgatory to that of a "tempering fire of love." One other noted writer once quipped: "I hope when I die, I get to Purgatory. That way I know I will eventually get to Heaven."

The Dogmatic Constitution on the Church, *Lumen Gentium*, November 24, 1964, the Second Vatican Ecumenical Council sums up so beautifully the power of the Communion of Saints...whom we are all called to become a part of when we are called home to Our Lord:

*The Church does not mention the entire multitude of saints by name in the Canon of the Mass. Through the light of Faith, though, we understand that they form a magnificent panorama of lay men and women who, through the activity of each day's task were tireless workers in the Lord's vineyard. After passing through unnoticed, and perhaps being misunderstood by the high and mighty, they were lovingly greeted by God our Father. They were humble yet great laborers for the growth of the Kingdom of God in history. In sum, they were the ones who knew how, with the help of God, to conserve and perfect during their life, the sanctification they received in Baptism.*

Life has its share of sufferings and challenges, but the Solemnity of All Saints gives us that tangible hope in the promise of Eternal Life, in union with the Holy Trinity, Our Blessed Lady, and the Communion of Saints. And as we approach the Commemoration of the Faithful Departed, we continue to pray for all the holy souls in Purgatory who await their moment to see the face of God.
