SECOND SUNDAY IN LENT – FEBRUARY 25, 2018

The Basilica of the National Shrine of the Immaculate Conception, Washington, D.C.

Two weeks ago, I took the train from Rhinecliff to Penn Station, New York and on to Union Station, Washington, D.C. for a little three day mid-winter trip what I refer to as my “spiritual home,” Washington, D.C. It is not for the politics or even necessarily for the history that drew me down to D.C. (rich in history as it is). Rather, it was for my regular pilgrimage to the magnificent Basilica of the National Shrine of the Immaculate Conception, west of the campus of the Catholic University of America in Northeast Washington. Of the many, many times I have been to the Basilica as both a student at Catholic University and later as a priest, this visit was particularly special. On December 8, 2017, the magnificent mosaic Trinity Dome was dedicated, essentially completing the sixth largest church in the world, begun on May 16, 1920. I remember back in 1978, a friend, well familiar with the Basilica said to me: “See that vast ceiling and dome? One day, it will be filled with mosaics.” Thirty-nine years later, the vision was fulfilled.

I would hope that within the year, our parish may be able to make a pilgrimage to “Mary’s Shrine.” Surely, Washington is quite far. Hyde Park is equally distant to Ottawa, the capital of Canada as it is to D.C. Choose your capital! Even if we have been to the Basilica, with the completion of the new Trinity Dome, a visit to the Basilica will be uniquely new prayerful experience. And as part of our possible pilgrimage we can explore the wonderful history of Washington. And as an added treat, we can venture over to the fringe of the Catholic University campus and see Redemptorist College on seventh Street, Northeast – an exact copy of Mount saint Alphonsus, in Esopus, but only smaller!

REVIEW OF ADORATION CHAPEL GUIDELINES IN THE EVENT OF INCLEMENT WEATHER

In the event of inclement weather, please tune into 92.1 FM for school closing listings, or on the web, search “Hyde Park Central School District,” hpcsd.org. If the district deems it necessary for a school closing or a delayed opening, the Adoration Chapel will be closed and reopen the following day after the 9:00 a.m. Mass.

Just a friendly reminder too, that the exposed Blessed Sacrament is never to be left unattended. On March 25, 2004, the Congregation for Divine Worship and the Discipline of the Sacraments in Rome issued the Instruction, *Redemptionis Sacramentum: On Certain Matters to be Observed and Avoided Regarding the Holy Eucharist*. In this instruction, Exposition of the Holy Eucharist, and the care and protection of the Eucharist is specifically addressed:

[#138] Still, the Most Blessed Sacrament, when exposed, *must never be left unattended even for the briefest space of time*. It should therefore be arranged that at least some of the faithful always be present at fixed times, even if they take alternating turns.

THE COLD AND INFLUENZA SEASON

Health care professionals have deemed the winter of 2018 as a very dangerous time for the spreading of the Influenza virus. It is said that the strain is so strong that even the current flu vaccinations are only 15% effective. With that said, worries over the spread of the virus through hand contact has many of our parishioners concerned, especially at the Sign of Peace during Holy Mass. The Sign of Peace at Mass is *optional*. A simple bow to the person next to you is quite adequate during the sign of peace. And if we encounter parishioners who do not hold their hand out, don’t be offended. It is simply a safety precaution during this heightened time of worry regarding the flu epidemic. That’s our motto here at Regina Coeli: *Safety First!*
