Easter Sunday of the Resurrection of the Lord 2018

*O truly necessary sin of Adam, destroyed completely
by the Death of Christ!*

*O happy fault that earned so great,
so glorious a Redeemer!*

From the *Exsultet*, The Easter Vigil in the Holy Night

It is said that when Saint Patrick emerged from his forty-day intense Lenten fast at Croagh Patrick in modern-day County Mayo he would celebrate the Easter Vigil in the Holy Night, and as he blessed the Easter fire, he could see all the other Easter fires that dotted the far-away hills of Ireland. To get to that point however, St. Patrick suffered greatly at the hands of a pagan culture that was not too welcoming to the message of the Gospel. But St. Patrick persevered and ultimately, those Easter fires became a testament to the powerful faith and resolve of Bishop Patrick and his followers ...fires of truth and light that dispelled the godless darkness of fifth century Ireland. The Easter fires that are lit in all the churches of the world during the Easter Vigil remains the glorious light that casts off the darkness of sin and death in our own world, two thousand years after the Paschal Mystery.

Look around and it is easy to fall into discouragement – assaults on the sanctity of human life, revolutionary attempts to redefine the sacred institution of marriage and family life and dare we say, the Church whose clergy have at times let the faithful down – a Church that can appear as rudderless. Doubtless, these are truly desperate times. But so was the climate for Christ in Jerusalem from Palm Sunday to His death on Calvary five days later. All seemed lost. The frightened and demoralized apostles who gave their whole lives to Christ, went back to their nets and boats.

That all changed on Easter Sunday. Death was dispelled by the Resurrection. And yet despite the glories of the Resurrection the Risen Christ never promised that the earthly lives of his followers would be that of ease and comfort. No authentically-lived Catholic life is immune from the Cross. The Risen Christ without the Five Wounds of His Passion would be an inauthentic Christ. But for us who remain steadfast in the Faith and true to the Gospel, an ineffable joy will permeate our lives here on earth, and will prepare us for that splendid reward that awaits those who love the Lord.

Christ gave the Church the Divine Guarantee. There is no room for fear...only rejoicing in the Resurrected Christ!

Christ is risen! He is truly risen!
