Ten Thousand Difficulties Do Not Make One Doubt

Imagine the Church in the modern world without the wisdom, prayerfulness, wit, poetry, and practicality of Blessed John Henry Newman (1801-1890). The Anglican clergyman-turned Catholic priest, apologist, and later cardinal continues to provide doctrinal and dogmatic clarity in an era increasingly defined by confusion and dissimulation.

A rising star in the Anglican Church in pre-Victorian England, Newman's study of sacred scripture, the writings of the Early Church Fathers, and his love for church history ultimately led to his conversion to Catholicism in 1845, and his ordination to the priesthood two years later. He often quipped: "To not embrace Catholicism is to lack a sense of history."

His path to Rome, and his subsequent role as a priest in a nation where the Catholic hierarchy, decimated by the Reformation in the sixteenth century, and restored in 1850, was anything but placid. Newman's difficulties culminated in a 1864 attack upon the Church, Catholic ecclesiology, and Father Newman in particular by Anglican minister and social reformer, Charles Kingsley. One year later, Newman responded to Kingsley in a series of brilliant essays which came to be known as the *Apologia pro vita sua*. And yet his sufferings continued. In 1875, Newman, plunged into a great sadness upon the death of his friend and fellow Oratorian priest, Father Ambrose Saint John wrote "There are wounds of the spirit that never heal."

Persevering in trial, Newman was bestowed the dignity of cardinal by Pope Leo XIII in 1879. Plagued by illness, Cardinal Newman spent his remaining years in prayer, reading, and writing at his beloved Birmingham Oratory, Edgbaston. Newman died on August 11, 1890. Cardinal Newman was beatified by Pope Benedict XVI on September 19, 2010.

In our Gospel reading on this Second Sunday of Easter, Saint John writes of the incredulity of Saint Thomas in response to the witness of the presence of the Resurrected Christ by the apostles. "Unless I see the mark of the nails in his hands and put my finger into the nailmarks and put my hand into his side, I will not believe" (John 20:25). Subsequently, Saint Thomas became known as "Doubting Thomas" and today, this sobriquet extends to anyone who might question an event or

social norm. This is so unfair! Thomas was a holy apostle. He went on to spread the Gospel as far as south Asia and was martyred at Chennai in India. *Doubt* is a serious offense against God. In the *Apologia*, Newman writes, "Ten thousand difficulties do not make one doubt." Saint Thomas just wanted proof of the Resurrection. And he received it right from the Resurrected Jesus.

Doubt is distinct from *questioning*. For instance, the person of faith may ponder the magnificence of God's ability to hear the prayers of all the faithful. Any questions in this matter are simply dispelled by our faith in an all-knowing and all-powerful God, whose magnificence cannot be fully grasped until we attain our Heavenly reward. According to the *Catechism of the Catholic Church* # 1806, the cardinal virtue of *Prudence*, which "disposes practical reason to discern our true good in every circumstance..." assists the faithful when faced with any proclivity toward *doubt*.

Saint Thomas simply asked to see the *authentic* Jesus. The true mark of resurrection is the five wounds. The mark of a true Christian is fortitude and courage in the face of adversity.

PLEASE INFORM THE PRIEST

Because of privacy laws, we cannot inquire about who is in the hospital. VBMC & Mid-Hudson Regional do provide clergy lists which are helpful to an extent. The parish affiliation item, which patients should be asked when admitted, does not always get asked, especially with emergency cases. One of our priests is scheduled to visit these hospitals every week. If families can notify us of a hospitalization at either of these facilities, we will make every effort to visit. Parishioners who will be hospitalized @ another facility such as NDH in Rhinebeck, please call us. Parishioners who face major surgery or any other type of hospital stay for serious medical reasons should receive the Anointing of the Sick from Fr. Morris before you enter the hospital. Call the Rectory to arrange for the Anointing to take place.
